



Coaches' Code of Conduct

This Code of Conduct applies to all Coaches participating in fencing activity at Haverstock Fencing Club. This Code does not supersede the British Fencing Code of Conduct but is in addition to it.

Haverstock Fencing Club Coaches are dedicated professionals and committed to the development of the individual within sport in a safe environment.

They will therefore:

- Comply with the relevant provisions of the [British Fencing Code of Conduct](#)
- Work within their own competence and qualifications
- Meet the minimum required standards to qualify as a British Fencing Registered Coach, including:
 - Be a member of British Fencing
 - Hold a recognised Coaching Qualification
 - Have a criminal records check
 - First Aid training
 - Safeguarding training
 - Agree to the Code of Conduct
 - Maintain a profile on the British Fencing Coaches Register.

In addition, when at the Club, they will:

- Strive to be a good role model at all times.
- Act as an ambassador for the Club
- Obey the instructions of the Committee and the Head Coach.
- Perform no action outside of their delegated responsibilities without prior permission from the Committee.
- Perform no action which might bring Haverstock Fencing Club into disrepute.

In addition, when at competition they will:

- Act as an ambassador for Haverstock Fencing Club at all times

- Do their best to support and encourage **all** fencers from Haverstock Fencing Club, **especially** in situations where they are competing against one another.
 - Respect the role of coaches/team managers and other officials in relation to managing participation in competition;
 - Perform no action which might bring Haverstock Fencing Club into disrepute.
